John Erdos Home will host the first ever group show for the Love Family. According to Erdos, "I know Kate and Tim from when they lived in Singapore and I would often compliment them on the artwork in their home. I kept asking when I could display and sell the work in the Gallery and so we are thrilled to finally have organized this show and aptly timed it with Valentines Day."

It isn't unusual for artistic, musical or other creative expression to be passed down through generations. Growing up in the LOVE family the appreciation and exposure to art was ever present. For Kate and Tim, it seemed a natural thing to showcase and nurture the early drawings and paintings of their children. Their children claimed that they were the only parents that framed those drawings and hung them on the walls instead of taping them to the refrigerator.

Meet the LOVE family, currently residing in the United States.

Tim, was an art major before he went into advertising. He is former Vice-Chairman of Omnicom Group, the leading worldwide advertising and marketing services company. Since retiring in 2013, he has resumed his life long passion for art with a philosophy of "changing the way we see the world."

Kate, was a student of Fine Art at the Escuela Massana in Barcelona and the Academie Charpentier in Paris and a graduate of Parsons School of Design in New York. The work she is showing represents a new exploration and a confluence of many of the artists influences as well as a concern for the environment (unconscious consumerism, over-packaging, waste) and a sense that there is beauty (and repurposing potential) in almost everything.

Harrison, the youngest of the family graduated from The Rhode Island School of Design. Shortly after completing University, he went on to pursue his own investigation of the role and purpose of Art within indigenous tribes in the Amazon. Harrison's work is inspired most of all by his creative family and an insatiable drive for exploration and experimentation. Harrison held solo show at John Erdos Home in 2011.

Eliza's primary passion is working with children at risk; she works as a Licensed Master Social Worker and animal therapist for children with emotional and behavioral problems. Although she considers herself the least artistic of the family members, she found her niche in photography. Though she never formally studied or practiced photography, Eliza finds comfort and therapeutic qualities in capturing the beauty of what she sees around her and in her travels.

William "Mac" is an artist and brand consultant. He holds the curious distinction of being named

‘the next generation of great American artist’ (“The Scotsman” 2004) and investigated by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security for “probably the coolest thing we’ve ever seen” (Wilfred Blancheffe, CT State Police).

Mac’s work is routed in Synaesthesia, the harmony of different or opposing impulses produced by a work of art. He earned his BFS in Art and BFA in Synaesthesia as a self--determined major combining psychology, philosophy and art at Skidmore College. He earned his MFA in Painting at the Edinburgh College of Art while participating in symposiums at St. Andrew’s Institute for Theology, Imagination and the Arts (ITIA) in Scotland.
